Do not think of emergency preparedness as a new OSHA Standard. Regulation number 1910.38, Emergency Action Plans, is designed to encourage organizations to prepare for situations requiring evacuation and control. The list of situations a company might face is extensive. Natural disasters, including hurricanes, tornadoes and floods; manufacturing accidents, fire, and bomb and terror threats are broad categories that an emergency action plan(s) is designed to address.
